

Project Description: You've written your sentences! You're practicing the pronunciation! Now it's time to plan for and create your video.

Things to think about before filming:



- What video application are you going to use?
  - You may use any video program; however, you must upload your video into Flipgrid.
  - You may record the entirety of your conversation in Flipgrid.
  - Do not overuse the enhancement tools (emojis, backgrounds, animated gif's, etc.) that your recording application offers.
- How will you add music and/or art?
  - Choose music and or art that enhances your video.
  - You do not have to compose the music or draw pictures. Do not use any pictures with copyright overlays. Do not use any music or pictures that require prior authorization unless you know the composer/artist.
  - Keep this simple! The most important part of your video is your description.
- Will props enhance your presentation?
  - Props are not required; however, if you are using props, practice with them before you record.
- You do not have to memorize your conversation.
  - Do think about making cue cards so your video looks more natural.
  - You can print cue cards from Quizlet – even bigger than the ones we made in class!
- Record yourself until you have a version that you are happy to submit.
  - Be sure that your voice is clear and easy to hear.
  - Be sure that there is no disruptive background noise. You need to be heard clearly over the music if you have it playing while you speak.
  - Don't speak too fast – you are not expected to have native pronunciation or speed.
- Review the rubric on the second page to see how you will be graded on this project.

Naming Convention: Your title must include your first and last names.

Flipgrid Class Codes: Be sure that you create your Flipgrid (or upload your video) in the correct class.
